Comments for Contemplation

You Are a Letter of Christ 2 Corinthians 2:14–3:6, Luke 10:1–12

1. Literacy is a key component to the development of nations, and in the last two centuries, teaching people to read has been a high priority for a number of Christian missions throughout the world. Part of the _____ for Christians to teach literacy is the opportunity to read the Bible.
2. It is hard for us to comprehend, but about 75% of the English Bible in our pews this morning, and a large percentage of whatever Bible you may own, has a strong connection to Tyndale’s English translation, a translation for which he _____ in order to get to us.
3. Friends: you are a letter of Christ, and as scary as it sounds, you may be the only Bible that some people ever read. Think about that. You may be the only Bible that some people, maybe many people, will ever take the time to read. That is an amazing _____ that God has given us.
4. Not many people come to Christ simply by being told that they can’t get drunk, they can’t drive too fast, or they can’t cheat on their girlfriend or boyfriend. That’s the letter, the rule, the law. It’s a necessary fact of life. But the Spirit behind those rules can give life, the Holy Spirit who inspires love and _____ for others and for ourselves.
5. Paul uses the image of a triumphal procession of a conquering hero in Roman times, when they used pleasant smelling incense that spread everywhere among the crowd, that reminds him of the altar of incense in the Jewish temple, when they believed that the smells were pleasing to the Lord, the God of Israel. He says, “But thanks be to God, who in Christ always leads us in triumphal procession, and through us spreads in every place the _____ that comes from knowing him.”
6. Friends: We are to be letters of Christ written with the Spirit of the living God on _____ of human hearts. What kind of letter of Christ are you?

Week Two: "On Being a Christian in a Post-modern World"


—What it means to be a Christian and why it is so vitally important in today's world.
