Comments for Contemplation

Abundantly Far More Than All We Can Ask or Imagine Ephes. 3:7–21, John 4:27–30, 39–42

1. Can people who believe in one God, one way of salvation and one moral code live responsibly, respectfully, and non-coercively among peoples who believe none of those things? Christians, of course, believe that we can and many do live that kind of responsible life. But it points out the _____ of bringing our faith to life, of integrating what we believe into the everyday aspects of our existence.
2. A missional church, or body of believers, is not only one that sends but one that is also sent. Jesus said, “As the Father has sent me, so I send you.” The missional church takes up its call from Jesus as a people who are _____.
3. But today we are going to discover that God’s grace is for everyone in the whole world, and that God, through the _____ at work within us in Christ Jesus, is able to do abundantly far more than all we can ask or imagine!
4. In Ephesians chapter one, it speaks of “the immeasurable greatness of his power for us who believe, according to the working of his great power. God put this power to work in Christ when he raised him from the dead....” So the same power that raised Jesus from the dead is at work in us who _____.
