Comments for Contemplation

Help! Numbers 11:1-15; 16-30

1. Write down your all time favorite food _____.
2. The Holy Spirit was not born nor created on the day of Pentecost. The Holy Spirit, along with Jesus, was present with God the Father from the beginning. The Trinity has always existed and the Holy Spirit was active and doing things long before Pentecost. At Jesus' baptism, the Spirit descended like a dove from the heavens. And here is a great story about the Holy Spirit's activity in the time of Moses. This is the Spirit that was with the judges, prophets, and kings and continues to inspire and sustain us today.
3. Moses complained and you can notice how often he said, "I", "my," and "me" in his prayer. His humanity overruled his desire of serving and bringing glory to God. He recognizes how beaten down he has become and just about gives up, saying, "I am not able." By himself we were not able. But he forgot that with God leading him, he really could do the impossible.
4. Moses is telling us that we should never diminish or envy the gifts, graces, and usefulness of others. We must not jump the gun and assume that we are the only ones God has chosen to use. It did not matter that Eldad and Medad were in the camp. Joshua was unwise in trying to quickly silence them. We must be wise and patient enough to accept others' gifts even if they are not just like us. They may not even be Presbyterian, but that's okay. Our concern should be that God is being served and glorified - even if we do not get the credit.


