Comments for Contemplation

Faith and Civic Involvement Romans 13:1–7, Matthew 22:15–22

1. If any religious movement of the sixteenth century was world-affirming, it was Calvinism. Yet Calvinism affirmed the world in order to master it and transform it, addressing its specific situations rather than simply thinking in abstract speculation. Throughout the writings of John Calvin, the founder of our Presbyterian and Reformed tradition, we find a determination to engage with the real issues of real human beings, along with the problems and _____ this brings with it. (McGrath)
2. Yet, McGrath says a note of caution must be entered here, and you will recognize it immediately when I say it. The caution is this: *those who seem to master the world are often those who have been mastered by it.* Those Christians who are judged to be successful in the world are all too often Christians who have capitulated to the standards of the world. The world-affirming attitude which undergirds the Calvinist outlook on life is always _____.
3. But if our entire lives are to be lived under the Lordship of Jesus Christ, then our civic involvement, our political involvement, our public sector involvement and our service to our community should all be subject to, and informed by, our _____ to Jesus.
4. Part of my attraction to the Reformed and Presbyterian tradition as a young man was the fact that Presbyterians were engaged in the world, involved in politics, encouraging people to vote and to be involved with issues and candidates, caring for the poor, stopping corruption, and helping the economy to stay healthy. Issues of life and death, war and peace, good and evil, freedom and coercion, and right and wrong are all _____ issues and not simply political issues.
5. In the book of Revelation, written near the end of the first century, Rome is referred to as “the great whore Babylon.” By that time, the persecution and murder of Christians was reaching its zenith under the emperor Domitian. Suffice it to say, that Christians, generally, should obey and respect governments and leaders who have a legitimate authority, but that obedience and respect is not without qualification, and there are times that Christians must stand up and _____. Great caution and wisdom must be exercised, of course, whenever such decisions are required.
