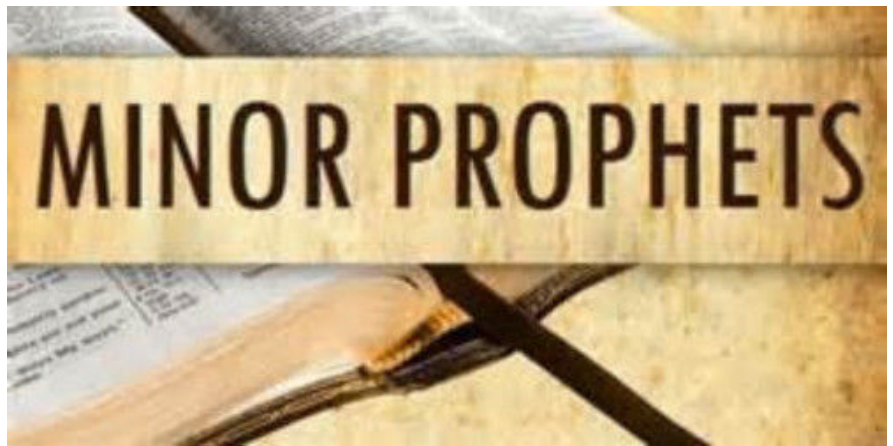

## Missional Messages from the Minor Prophets



“What do you know about the Minor Prophets of the Old Testament?” When asked this question, many people in the church, even long-time Christians, often say, “Very little.” This summer is a chance for you to experience the transforming messages of these little known prophets of the Lord, to whom Jesus referred regularly. Here are a few questions that you may discover answers for if you come:

- Why would God command a prophet to marry a prostitute?
- Who prophesied about God’s Spirit coming on “all flesh” 400 years before it happened on the Day of Pentecost in A.D. 30?
- To whom did God show a plumb line, to show that God’s people were like a wall that is leaning?
- Which prophet got a fishing lesson when he tried to run away from the Lord?
- Who told us that the Lord requires us to do what is just, to show constant love, and to live in humble fellowship with our God?
- Which prophet celebrates the fall of Nineveh, capital of the Assyrian empire?
- Who anticipated a humble king making peace, making a triumphal entry on a donkey?
- Who described the coming of the Lord like a refiner’s fire, and like strong soap?

## God Started with a Family

Hi friends,

Rich and I are excited to offer this opportunity to study Mike and Sally Breen's book *Family on Mission: Integrating Discipleship into the Fabric of our Everyday Lives*. Mike has been a pioneer in missional discipleship, and his wife Sally has been along for the whole ride. They each provide a unique perspective in how they have learned to integrate discipleship into the natural rhythms of their own family.

The book covers God's design for us to be part of a family, how Jesus gathered a family on mission, and how we can imitate him in our homes, neighborhoods, networks, and our church.

To provide flexibility for the summer, Rich and I will lead two different meeting times each week: Sundays from 1:30 to 3:00 p.m. and Wednesdays from 6:00 to 7:30 p.m. We will meet in the parlor and childcare is available with an RSVP. This way, you can plan around various calendar conflicts. We also know that few will be in town every week, so do not let that stop you from signing up. We will communicate weekly to make sure everyone stays with the class.

The book costs \$16 and families are encouraged to share one copy. Teens are definitely invited to participate as well.

Please let us know which session you plan on attending so we make sure we have enough materials on hand. Also, if you would like childcare, please provide the number of children and their ages.

We began on Sunday, June 25, at 1:30 and Wednesday, June 28, at 6:00. We will meet a total of 11 times, and the first meeting was a brief introduction and distribution of books. We're excited for where God is leading us and learning how to be a family on mission.

## Elementary Sunday School

### Uniqueness is a reflection of the character of God.

In Deuteronomy 6:4, Moses tells the Israelites, “*Israel, listen to me. The LORD is our God. The LORD is the one and only God.*” (NIRV)

No one is like our God. And God created people in His image. Every single person on earth is unique. We have DNA, personalities, experiences, and relationships that make us different from each other. This makes us uniquely wired and wonderfully made.

### Only Jesus could rescue us.



Jesus, as the Son of God, was fully God and fully man. No one else before or since has been able to make that claim. Jesus was uniquely positioned to rescue us from the consequences of our sin. He alone could live the perfect life, die a human death, yet be raised to life again. And because of that, we can now experience a renewed relationship with God and live with Him forever.

Because we are uniquely made in God's image, we think it's important for us to help our kids and families discover more about what that means. This month, we take a closer look at the idea of uniqueness—discovering who God made you to be so you can make a difference.

Our Memory Verse for July comes from Ephesians 2:10: “*We are God's creation. He created us to belong to Christ Jesus. Now we can do good works. Long ago God prepared these works for us to do.*” (NIRV) God has a plan for each of us. He invites us into the work He's been doing in the world since the beginning of time to bring people to Him. God made us to be part of that!

As we help kids discover more about the way God uniquely created them, we'll look at some people in the Bible and find out how God used their uniqueness to help Him change the world.



# Hearts of Faith

## Expanding the Arlington Life Shelter

At our June 4 all-church picnic, we learned that the Arlington Life Shelter (ALS) has acquired, through donations, the property next door to the current building. The shelter is now enlisting the 61 faith communities that currently support the shelter to be a part of the capital campaign to build a new ALS building.

The Hearts of Faith Campaign is an opportunity for individuals from the faith community congregations that serve the ALS through food teams and other volunteer services. The overall goal of the campaign is to raise \$500,000 of the total \$4.2M needed. Jim Reeder, the shelter campaign manager, said that overall fundraising for the building is going well. He let us know that it really helps the shelter obtain grants from foundations when those foundations see so many community donations also supporting the campaign.



The new building will have a Hearts of Faith Kitchen, in honor of all the years of meals prepared and served by faith groups, including FPCA. Each faith group participating in the campaign will be listed on the donor wall in the new kitchen.

Those who attended the presentation received a handout with donation information. You may use that form to submit an individual donation to this program; it has a line for you to link your donation back to FPCA. 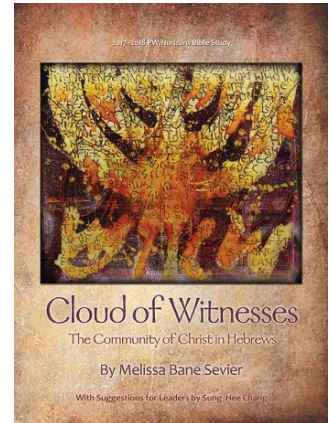
# Women's Bible Study

Hebrews is a significant book of the Bible, and is also significantly different from every other book in the Bible. It consists of thirteen chapters, all of which are packed with theology, metaphor, comparisons, and spirituality. This study explores nine major themes, relates those themes to other parts of our faith tradition, and ties them together with the overarching motif of community. The Rev. Dr. Betsy Pense will guest-teach three of the lessons.

The community for which the letter was written interacts, in a sense, with all the communities of which you are a part, because you bring those groups with you wherever you go - they have helped form you into the person you are.
