

Comments for Contemplation

Time: Something To Be Redeemed Colossians 4:2-6; 2 Corinthians 5:16-6:10

1. Are we busy with things that really matter? Or are we primarily busy with distracting ourselves, so that we don't feel our aloneness? Are we busy with things that help other people? Are we busy with things that make a positive difference in our lives or in the lives of our family and friends? Are we busy with things that the Lord would rank high on his priority list? Or are we busy with things that only we would rank as important? Time, in many ways is our most precious commodity. How we use it and with whom we take time is a _____ issue.
2. And that brings us to our highest priority. Spending time with the Lord is essential to keeping everything else in perspective. There are many ways to do this, but we need to find a rhythm that enables us to grow in our faith in Christ, and in our relationship with him. As we begin our Stewardship Emphasis season, we begin with what it means to be stewards of the time that the Lord has given us. For many of us, it should start with _____.
3. The Bible is filled with people who started in one direction. But it didn't work, so they had to move in a different direction. [Barnes says,] "Moses' first plan was to kill the taskmaster who was beating a slave. David's first plan was to be a shepherd. Jonah's first plan was to go to Tarshish. Jeremiah's first plan was to keep Jerusalem from falling. Peter's first plan was to prevent Jesus from being crucified. Paul's first plan was to evangelize Jews. All of them had to go to Plan B, which was God's plan from the _____."
4. Chronos is chronological time, sometimes seen as a series of randomly organized incidents and accidents, having little or no connection to the purpose of a Creator God. The other word for time is kairos, which is time as opportunity. Kairos is a constant opportunity to explore God's work in our lives, and _____ in God's kingdom work.
5. Malcolm Muggeridge may have had "chronicles of wasted time," but we can see that through our relationship with Christ we may "redeem the time," meaning recover or restore that time for God's purposes. In this instance, Paul is saying that we need to count every moment with people outside of the faith as an opportunity to speak graciously, wisely, and season our conversation with salt, or with spiritual understanding. Imagine what might be done for God's kingdom, if we were to _____ the time and make the most of every opportunity that we had in speaking with those who need to grow in their relationship with the Lord.
