## Comments for Contemplation

I AM the Bread of Life Exodus 16:9–18; John 6:25–38

1. The Israelites believed that God was not aloof from the world, and they had a sense of the immediacy of God's presence. Signs and wonders of God's activity were seen in many events that seemed to them *sign*-ificant and *wonder*-ful. But even the really extraordinary ones like the parting of the sea or the manna, did not make them all trust in God and his faithfulness. They, like us, had to learn to \_\_\_\_\_ the Lord, and had to grow in their faith.
2. Of course, these two planes intersect, and we human beings can get glimpses of God's kingdom breaking into our experience. And we may look at something that is on that line and we may say, look – a sign, a wonder, a miracle. And someone else may look at it with different eyes and say, look – a rare occurrence, a strange event, a coincidence. And the reason we can both see different things is that the events are a part of this straight line, part of both the \_\_\_\_\_ plane and the human plane.
3. In the Arabic world, *man* is still the name for these plant insects, and their honeydew, which is regarded today as a great delicacy, is called *man essimmaor* 'manna from heaven.' As for the quails, flocks of them migrate over this region in the spring, and, when exhausted, are easily \_\_\_\_\_.
4. The Israelites had to trust that it would be provided by the Lord daily, and they could gather both manna and quail as they needed for that day, depending on the size of the family, or the number in their tent. We read, "...those who gathered much had nothing over, and those who gathered little had no \_\_\_\_\_."
5. Jesus makes clear that it is the Father who gives the true bread from heaven. He says, "For the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world." The crowd said to Jesus, "Sir, give us this bread always." They are looking for a divine sustenance that will both nourish them and \_\_\_\_\_ for them.

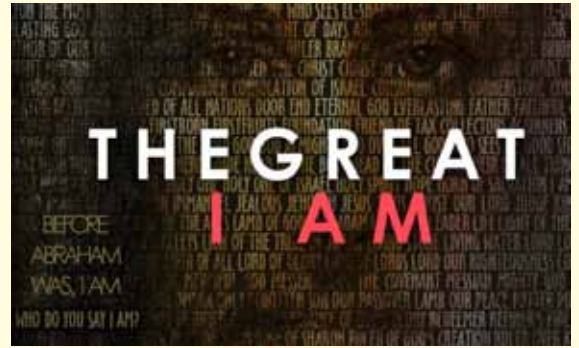
