



Comments for Contemplation

Making the Most of the Time Ephesians 5:1–20

1. Christianity also teaches that our minds, souls, bodies and spirits are connected and important: that God is interested in what we believe, what we think, what we say and what we do (in private and in _____), and each part affects the others.
2. When we persist in our sin and ignore God’s Word and God’s wisdom, we can find ourselves lost in darkness, without guidance and without direction. But today’s lesson from Ephesians helps us understand how, by the grace of God, we can live as children of _____, and how our behavior must follow our beliefs and our thoughts.
3. If someone says to you, “it doesn’t matter what you believe so long as you believe,” you need to say to that person, “Baloney.” Say it nicely, of course. But it’s baloney. If you believe false and dangerous things you will reap the negative consequences of that belief, whether it is a religion or philosophy or a worldview or a personal _____.
4. “For once you were darkness, but now in the Lord you are light. Live as children of light—for the fruit of the light is found in all that is good and right and true. Try to find out what is pleasing to the Lord. Take no part in the unfruitful works of _____, but instead expose them...for everything that becomes visible is light.... Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, making the most of the time, because the days are evil.”
5. Maybe you are thinking, well I have my own views about what is good and true and right, especially when it comes to sexual ethics. Ask yourself, “Are your views pleasing to the Lord? Have you prayerfully researched the Bible, the Church, and Christian Ethics historically to arrive at your views, and are they generally _____ by Christians worldwide?”
