Comments for Contemplation

Wandering—The Forty Years

Numbers 11:10–15, 31–34; 13:1–2, 25–28, 30–32; Deuteronomy 8:11–20

1. Instead, the Lord shows that He is both merciful and just by giving Israel the law, or the teaching, in the form of ten commands. These commands show that the Lord wants to be in right relationship with us, and that He has given us the means by which we can live out the behavior that God expects of us. Chris rightly noted that this was a great _____ to the world because the Lord, who revealed Himself to Moses, is not whimsical, ruthless or capricious.
2. But instead of giving thanks to the Lord, and for his humble servant, Moses, the people grumbled and complained and blamed Moses and God for their troubles, rather than looking at their blessings. That should sound somewhat familiar to our _____ today, because we tend to do the very same thing.
3. Joshua then spoke up, “If the Lord is pleased with us, he will bring us into this land and give it to us.... Only do not rebel against the Lord; and do not fear the people of the land, for they are no more than bread for us; their protection is removed from them, and the Lord is with us; do not fear them.” But the whole congregation threatened to _____ them.
4. Friends: there are occasions when we are faced with challenging and risky decisions, for which the consequences are not clear but they are immense and long term. Opting for the apparently safe choice is not always the right way to go, but opting for the choice that is faithful to God always is. Caleb and Joshua lost the vote of the spies by a ten to two margin. But we can see that God’s will is not always with the _____. Caleb and Joshua opted for the choice that they knew was faithful to the Lord. And so must we.
5. Moses says, “When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them...and all that you have is multiplied, then do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery.... Do not say to yourself, ‘My power and the might or my own hand have gotten me this wealth.’ But _____ the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you power to get wealth, so that he may confirm his covenant.... If you do forget the Lord your God and follow other gods to serve and worship them, I solemnly warn you today that you shall surely perish.”
