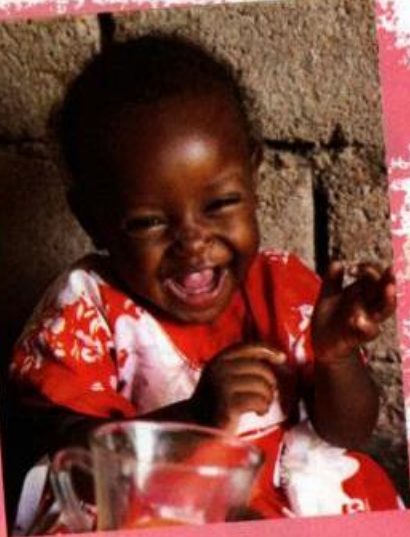

Medical care helps sick children get better fast. Show Amir the route to reach sick children!

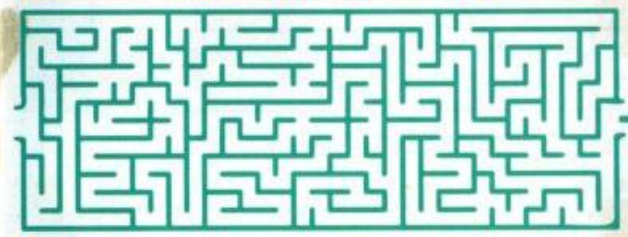

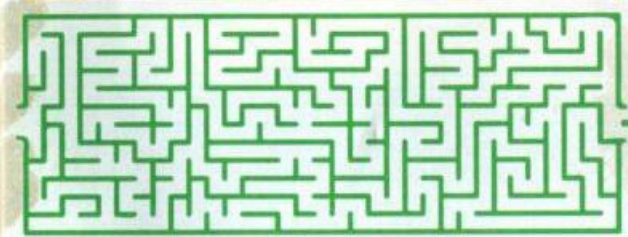
