

Comments for Contemplation

The Announcement of the Messiah

Isaiah 9:2-7, Luke 1:26-38

- 1. These remarkable words were delivered by Isaiah of Jerusalem more than 700 years before Jesus Christ was born. And as we will discover, Jesus is clearly the only person to whom these _____ titles can appropriately apply.
- 2. Many Christians simply try to keep their faith in a place where it doesn't get too intrusive in their lives. They limit their commitment to Christ, and as a result, they also limit what they can hear and from God.
- 3. It might be fair to say that if Mary had not responded in faith to Gabriel's message, we might not be here today, and the two-thirds of the world that claims to believe in our Lord Jesus Christ would be dramatically different. But, by the grace of God, Mary did respond in faith and offers us the ultimate ______ of faith. In fact, Mary is a perfect example of how we are to receive God's love.
- 4. Of course, at this point, I believe Mary had a choice. She could have rejected the news as terrible, and protested this call to her from the Lord. Like Zechariah in the story before this, she could have shown no faith and complained. She was young, unmarried, poor, had a plan for the future that this would foul up, and had to figure out a way to tell ________ to whom she was engaged.
- 5. Mary, who is elevated, remains humble. Her elevation did not create a barrier between her and others so that they became her servants. She, who is honored above all women, did not become proud. She is known to the disciples and the early Christian believers as one who bore the Christ child but who remained humble. She not only ______ the gospel, she lived it.
