Comments for Contemplation

	Of First Importance 1 Corinthians 15:1-11, John 20:1-18		
1.	But as others look at us, there, no doubt are some who say, "People have forgotten God. That's why all this has happened." I hope that the people here today are among those who have not forgotten God. Do we know what is of first in our lives?		
2.	We need to put first things first, and see if, by the grace of God, we can't become better people and make a better world. But most of all, we need to entrust our lives to the One who died a death on the cross, and yet was raised as our living Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.		
3.	6. If Christ is not alive, then his unjust death at the cross was simply the end, not a means of for the entire world. Christ's followers, by their own admission, did not expect his resurrection.		
4.	Not only does it remind us that death does not have the last word in our human experience, but also that Jesus' divine life of love, and compassion and servanthood has been vindicated by God through Jesus' death and resurrection. We can say with confidence: Jesus was who he said he was, God'sSon, the Messiah, the living Son of the living God.		
5.	The early Christians did not hesitate to identify themselves with a man who had been branded a traitor and a criminal. They endured imprisonment, torture, exile, and death rather than renounce their commitment to the resurrected Christ. Even from a secular point of view, the evidence for the resurrection is surprisingly		
6.	And after they go back home, Jesus' first resurrection appearance comes to Mary Magdalene. And Jesus gives her the assignment of giving the message to his disciples, that she had seen the
