## **Comments for Contemplation**

Nahum & Zephaniah: A Chance for Reformation Nahum 1:1–3a, 12–2:2; Zephaniah 3:1–5, 8–15

1.	Josiah also realized that unless some serious reforms were made, and unless people genuinely repented and gave themselves anew to the Lord, that the judgment of the Lord of history awaited them. And so King Josiah began to call all the priests and prophets and the people of Judah together to stand before the house of the Lord and he read to them the words of the book of the which they had found.
2.	"Before [Josiah] there was no king like him, who turned to the Lord with all his heart, and with all his soul, and with all his might, according to the law of Moses; nor did any like him arise after him" (-2 Kgs 23:25). After the reforms of Josiah, Judah began to experience a period of expansion and prosperity, and hope. It looked to a time of a renewed and united kingdom, much like when was king. It was unfortunately, tragically brief.
3.	And Nahum gives the note of hope, that "the Lord is restoring the majesty of Jacob, as well as the majesty of Israel, though ravages have ravaged them and ruined their branches" (Nah. 2:2). The sack of the city of Nineveh is a sign that God is leveling the score, and that the punishment that the Assyrians have given out will now come back upon them, with from the Hebrew people as well as many others.
4.	But are lives being changed for Christ? Is our community and is our world being served by our church? Are we getting outside the walls of our church and the borders of our country to share Christ with a needy world? And does our worship reflect those priorities, both in the way we welcome people and in the way we open our hearts to God and to his on our lives?
5.	Christians believe that Jesus is the way, the truth and the life, not a way, a truth and a life. It is Jesus Christ who teaches us to respect other religions and faiths without doing them the disservice of saying that we all believe the same things. We don't, and we should be honest about why we respect people and their backgrounds, but that not all ideas about God and truth aregood and true.
