Comments for Contemplation

Malachi: Loving Father or Vending Machine? Malachi 2:10–17; Malachi 3:1–12

1.	And I hope you now understand that Biblical prophecy is not about strange visions about future happenings at the end of time. Those are called apocalyptic writings. Rather, Biblical prophecy is about prophets speaking God's Word into a given context, a divine word that reverberates into every age, a word that tells us what the future of us right now in terms of loving God and loving our neighbor, and of living with justice and mercy and faith.
2.	The question and answer form of the book of Malachi is a bit confusing, until you consider that the setting is a court of law. In ancient times, difficult cases were brought to the Jewish priest for adjudication. Here, the prophet imagines himself as the priestly
3.	Faithfulness to the covenant and to their relationship with the Lord is the key to receiving their restoration with the Lord. "Return to me and I will return to you,' says the Lord of hosts" (Mal. 3:7b). The Lord is saying to his people, "I have loved you and I love you still." And we learn this general principle from Malachi, that when we respond in love to God's love then the windows of heaven are opened for us, that he might the world through us.
4.	But the truth is the blessings are discovered in the obedience and in the giving. And people of faith know that God does provide. We may be blessed materially and financially, but it is often the result of the giving of our lives to the Lord, and loving the Lord with all our heart and soul and mind and strength, and our neighbor as ourselves.
5.	The truth is that the Church exists to serve Jesus by serving others. It does take resources to be the Church that Jesus has called us to be. But if we have given our hearts to the Lord, the are rarely a problem.
