

Our faith and its assurance do not proceed from flesh and blood, but come to us by the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. We affirm that the Holy Spirit is God, equal with the Father and with his Son Christ Jesus, who sanctifies us and brings us into all truth by his own working. For by nature we cannot see light when it shines, nor give assent to God's will as revealed, except by the Spirit of the Lord Jesus.

And so, as we confess that God the Father created us when we existed not, as his Son our Lord Jesus redeemed us when we were enemies to him, so also do we confess that the Holy Spirit does sanctify and regenerate us without respect to any merit proceeding from us.
