Comments for Contemplation

I Aм God's Son Matthew 22:41–46; John 10:22–39

1.	The beautiful window that we are looking at this week has to do with Jesus' identity as God's Son. Rather than depicting the scene of today's Scripture, it instead shows us elements of the Christmas story, where Jesus is revealed as God's Son. We see the star, the manger, three crowns representing the three magi, and the three gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And if you look closely, you will see the top part of a like a rising sun emerging from behind the manger, reminding us that God's Son also died for the sins of the world.
2.	Within twenty years of Jesus' death the apostle Paul spoke of Christ as the one "in whom the fullness of God was pleased to dwell," as the "image of the invisible God," the very agent of creation and salvation "in whom all things in heaven and on earth were created" (Colossians 1:15-20). Those words identify the purpose, work, and even of God inseparably with Jesus. [Jim Edwards]
3.	Did Jesus know that he had an identity which his followers later came to understand in terms of his being God? If he was God (and most Christians do agree on that), did <i>he</i> know who he was? It think the simplest answer to that is yes [In scripture] Jesus is always shown as being aware of a particular relationship with God that enables him to speak with awesome authority. There is never a scene in the Gospel portrait where he something about himself that he did not know before. [Raymond Brown]"
4.	It should not surprise us that the titles "Messiah" and "Son of God" are closely related. The gospel of Mark starts with the straightforward statement: "Here begins the Good News about Jesus the Messiah, the Son of God" (Mark 1:1). When Peter confesses his belief that Jesus is the Messiah, he says, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the God" (Matthew 16:16). [Mark D. Roberts]
5.	There are times in our lives when we are tempted to doubt that God has chosen us to be his children, to doubt that he has gifted us with gifts to be used for God's kingdom work, and to doubt that he loves us with a powerful, steadfast and everlasting love beyond what we have ever known. That is when, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we must trust the promises of the Lord in Scripture, affirming our calling and our identity and that we are utterly by the Lord.
