#### **Comments for Contemplation**

I Ам the True Vine Isaiah 5:1–7; John 15:1–11

- 1. It started to become clear that Christianity was more about faith in a person than about following rules, more about a relationship with God than about being religiously righteous, and more about joy in following Jesus than about submitting to stifling, and \_\_\_\_\_\_ regulations. In short, I found that Jesus was more fun than I could have imagined.
- 2. Real Christian faith is full of life, and love, and joy even in the midst of the real stuff of life like suffering, pain, disease, death and sorrow, as we have had here recently. As I discovered as a young man, serious Christians don't hide themselves from joy or from suffering. Rather they face the realities of this world knowing the realities of another world, and they carry the resources of that spiritual realm into the pains and problems of this realm, with the \_\_\_\_\_\_ and the help and the love of the One who is Lord of both realms.
- 3. The Lord expected choice grapes to spring up, but in a strange turn of events, the vineyard yields only tiny wild grapes, of little use to anyone. The prophet tells of the judgment of the vinegrower: this vineyard shall be laid to waste, the wall and hedge removed, and it shall be trampled down. Why? Because the Lord looked for justice in the land and found only bloodshed, he looked for righteousness, and a \_\_\_\_\_\_ for the poor and oppressed, but heard only a cry!
- 4. As we see people of all ages wander down the primrose path to destruction, are we prepared to offer any alternatives to them? Do we even believe that Jesus makes a difference in peoples' lives? Do we even believe he makes a difference in <u>our</u> lives? And if we do, why don't we \_\_\_\_\_\_ that good news with them?
- 5. "Now we are at the center of the secret of joy. The Lord does more than simply prune the irrelevant or distracting; he gives us the gift of being able to perceive our difficulties and troubles as occasions of his pruning providence. He does not send the rough places, people or perplexities, but he surely uses them! He gives us the power to choose what our \_\_\_\_\_\_ toward them will be...." [Dr. Lloyd John Ogilvie]
