

## Comments for Contemplation

I Am the Alpha and the Omega Isaiah 44:6–8; Revelation 1:1–8, 21:1-8, 22:12–16a

- 1. Many of the other sayings we are dealing with have come from the Gospel According to John, but today's saying is found in the book of The Revelation to John, which is a series of visions that repeat with wonderful variety certain great principles of God's just and merciful \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the whole creation.
- 2. That is part of the idea being communicated here. We are being told that all things find their wholeness and completion in Jesus Christ, who is the beginning and end of all things, in whom also we may find our \_\_\_\_\_ and completion.
- 3. But just as a gifted runner who never practices will falter if he runs only when the track meet has arrived, so also the Christian who does not cultivate a vital and living relationship with Jesus will find himself or herself unable to receive all that Jesus has for him or her, when the \_\_\_\_\_\_ times come.
- 4. There are at least three important areas in our lives of which Jesus Christ is the Alpha and Omega, or the beginning and the end: Jesus is the beginning and end of our \_\_\_\_\_\_; he is the beginning and end of our \_\_\_\_\_\_; and he is the beginning and end of our
- 5. Only Jesus, and the power of the Holy Spirit can redeem and sustain a true friendship. And whenever we allow Jesus to be the center of our relationships, they have the possibility to become what they were designed and intended to be: filled with the very love that comes from God, and a powerful means for \_\_\_\_\_ and sustaining us in life.
