Comments for Contemplation

Creation: The Beginning of Life as We Know It

Genesis 1:1-8, 26-2:3, 2:4-9, 15-25, 3:1-7

- 1. *The Story* is basically an abridged Bible, with the words of Scripture woven together so that you can get a feel for how the Biblical narrative moves chronologically. It does not replace the Bible, of course, and, in worship, we will continue to read chapters and verses from our Bibles. But *The Story* will help us to grasp the great and overarching theme of a deeply loving God who is passionately seeking for a right ______ with you and me, his people, the crown of his creation.
- 2. So God was alone in the beginning. That should tell us that *there is only one uncreated being and that is God.* Jews and Christians are not dualists. We do not believe that there is an equal and opposite being to God, like the devil, and that God and the devil are battling for control of the creation. No, in Christian theology the devil is a created spiritual being that has rebelled against God, and can make life difficult for humans through ______, but is in no way God's equal.
- 3. Human beings are created in the image of God. That does not mean we simply look like God. It means that we are given God-like capacities for reason, compassion, love, and work. Our brains enable us to discern and understand some of the creation, precisely because the creation was fashioned in the mind of God, and now our minds can grasp small bits and pieces of it, because we were created in God's image. Also notice that the image of God is not male or female, but it is both male and female. That means we cannot understand God without understanding the complementary characteristics of both male and female human beings, and they can be ______.
- 4. But all work and no rest makes Johnny and Sally neurotic. I stole this line, but I would say, remember the Sabbath Day and keep it holy. Saturday is really the Jewish Sabbath, and Sunday is the Lord's Day for Christians, so everyone here can thank the Lord, as well as Jews and Christians, for their weekends. That means resting for a day, and giving it to the Lord for worship and rest. What a _______ idea! And how many of our problems in this world might that solve?
- 5. "God did not take Eve out of Adam's head that she might rule over him or to be superior to him. Nor did God take Eve out of Adam's feet to be trampled upon by him or that she might be lower than him. But God took Eve out of Adam's side that she might be his equal, and from under his arm that she might be protected by him, and from close to his heart that she might be _____ by him." (adapted from Matthew Henry)
