



Comments for Contemplation

Deliverance: God Calls Moses

Exodus 1:6–12; 2:11–15; 3:1–15; 14:5–9, 13–16, 21–31

1.	God does not call many people to be pastors, but he does call every Christian to do something for his
	Kingdom. Each of us is given a gift for ministry, and letting God use our gifts in His service is a key
	to discovering the right path for our lives. As we look, today, at the call of Moses, perhaps the greatest
	prophet in the Old Testament, may we, by the grace of God, be inspired to a new level of faith and
	in our lives.

- 2. A Levite man and his wife had a fine baby boy whom they hid for three months, then decided to put him in a basket on the Nile in hopes that he would be found and live. Sure enough, as the baby's sister watched, the daughter of Pharaoh the king, while she was bathing in the Nile, found this Hebrew baby in the basket, and decided to raise the boy herself. She asked for a _______, and hired the boy's mother to serve in that capacity. Then notice, (in chapter two verse ten), that the Pharaoh's daughter named the boy *Moses*.
- 3. We read there, "After a long time the king of Egypt died. The Israelites groaned under their slavery, and cried out. Out of the slavery their cry for help rose up to God. God heard their groaning, and God remembered their covenant with Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. God looked upon the Israelites and God took _______ of them." Have you ever felt like God might have forgotten his promises to you?
- 4. God went on to say that he was sending Moses to Pharaoh to tell him to free the people of Israel. Moses said, "Who am I, that I should go to Pharaoh, and bring the Israelites out of Egypt?" And God said, "I will be with you;..." Moses said to God, "If I come to the Israelites and say to them, 'The God of your has sent me to you,' and they ask me, 'What is his name?' what shall I say to them?" God said to Moses, "I AM WHO I AM."
- 5. The Lord saw, the Lord heard, the Lord called, and the Lord responded. Moses, the murderer, the fugitive, the shepherd, and the prophet also responded to God's call. He hesitated, he was reluctant, he suffered and he told the Lord to send someone else. But in the end, he and obeyed the Lord so that he could lead God's people. Are we ready to do the same?
