Comments for Contemplation

The Trials of a King: David

2 Samuel 11:1–15, 26–27a; 2 Samuel 11:27b–12:14

1. But as our story begins today, in a time of comfort, ease, and, perhaps, boredom, King David seemed to lose his thankfulness, his gratitude to God, or as Chesterton suggests, his happiness doubled by wonder. The adage about how _____ corrupts seems to apply here.
2. We should learn at least three things from this tragic story. 1) Beware of thinking that you are privileged and entitled; 2) The Lord has given us clear directions on trusting God and living by faith in him in our moral and sexual behavior. We ignore those directions at our own peril; and 3) While all sin separates us from God, and God can forgive us for our sin, the _____ of our sin differs.
3. Like a football coach that wants to lead from a heated press box high above the cold, windswept field, King David would only lead his army from his nice home in Jerusalem. And instead of living that life of gratitude and thankfulness to God, which he had demonstrated in the past, David's life of comfort and ease had weakened his courage, his _____ and his discipline.
4. Third, this is a story for all of us, because all of us have a story like this, a story of sin and our attempts to justify it, or cover it up. We should not look down on David, but we can _____ from his mistakes.
5. We must not think of ourselves as privileged and entitled, but rather as dependent and servants of the living God. That might have saved a lot of heartache for David, if he had lived that out. We need to know what God's word says so that we can know what God _____ of us, and follow.
