

Comments for Contemplation

Standing Tall, Falling Hard: Saul

1 Samuel 8:4–18; 9:1–2, 15–17; 15:10–11, 22–26

1. “Sin and evil are self-centeredness and pride that lead to oppression against others, but there are two forms of this. One form is being very bad and breaking all the rules, and the other form is being very good and keeping all the rules and becoming self-righteous. One is being a _____ and the other is being a Pharisee.” (Tim Keller)
2. This is a big part of the story of Samuel and King Saul. It is the story of people, like us, wanting a human king rather than having God as their King. It is the story of people, like us, wanting to be like the nations and cultures around them, rather than following God’s will to be _____ his people.
3. We say, Lord, we need this; Lord, what about this; Lord, why this; Lord, could you fix this? And we often grow frustrated and impatient with God, when our prayers are not answered as we would like, and in our timing. There are days when it seems that the lamp of God is about to flicker out and die. But we can trust that the _____ of God will not go out, so long as there are believers and leaders who pray, “Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening.”
4. Samuel obeys the word of the Lord and finds the king the people ask for. Saul is the most handsome man in Israel and is head and shoulders taller than any other. And while he shows flashes of brilliance, and at times is filled with the Spirit of the Lord, Saul is nevertheless a _____ character whose dark side often takes over, much like Edward Hyde did for Dr. Jekyll.
5. Whenever I am tempted to think that I can keep everybody happy, whenever I’m tempted to think that I can solve all of the church’s problems, whenever I’m tempted to think that our health as a church depends primarily on my charisma and my abilities, I know that Mr. Hyde is rearing his attractive head. It is only by the _____ of God working through our faith that we can receive all that God has for us.
