

Comments for Contemplation

No Ordinary Man Mark 5:21–43; Matthew 7:7–20

- 1. Chapter five of Mark's gospel, from which we read this morning, might be called the "St. Jude chapter," because each of the characters mentioned in this chapter have found all of their human hopes to be exhausted, but nevertheless, they are able to find ______ hope in Jesus. Maybe that relates to something you are going through.
- 2. And the disciples who were afraid of drowning are now more afraid still of the power and authority wielded by this rabbi. They say to one another, "Who then is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?" And that is a question that ______ all that happens in this section of Mark's gospel, a question that we may ask as well. Who, then, is this?
- 3. Jesus urges the man to go tell his friends how much *the Lord* had done for him, and the man went and told his friends how much *Jesus* had done for him. So first Jesus shows his Lordship over the external forces of the wind and the sea, quieting them for the boat ride. Then he shows his Lordship over the internal ______ powers, quieting the spirit of this man possessed by demons. Who, then, is this?
- 4. She believed that, even though she was ritually unclean because of her condition, and made everyone she touched unclean, that touching just the garment of Jesus could heal her. And it did. Twelve years of shame and frustration are resolved in a momentary touch of Jesus. And Jesus' response is remarkable. Her being in public and touching him were both violations of the Torah, and Jairus would now be aware of this as well. But Jesus says, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in ______, and be healed of your disease."
- 5. Craig Barnes reminds us that "It is impossible to follow Jesus and not be led away from something. That journey away from the former places and toward the new place is what converts us.... The purpose of conversion in the Bible is not our spiritual self-actualization but Christ's mission.... it always involves the extraordinary process of creating visionary ______ out of fearful disciples."
