

The	End of Time F	Revelation 4:1–11; 5	:1–14	
1. "At first the Roman authorities regarded Christians as a sect within Judaism. But toward the close of the first century it became clear that the church was separate from the synagogue; therefore, Christians who refused to participate in emperor worship exposed themselves to the charge of not only being unpatriotic, but also of being subversive and enemies of the state. Consequently, at various times and places they suffered because of their faith." (Dr. Bruce Metzger)				
2. This John was in exile writing on the island of Patmos, about 55 miles from the port city of Ephesus. From the mid-second century on, the book was widely but not universally ascribed to the apostle John, the son of Zebedee, who was one of Jesus' original twelve disciples. It is written to seven churches that existed in Asia Minor at that time: the churches at Ephesus, Smyrna, Pergamum, Thyatira, Sardis, Philadephia, and Laodicea.
