Comments for Contemplation

Jesus, the Savior of the World Acts 4:1–12; 1 John 4:7–16

1.	In much of today's thinking, Christianity is thought to be chiefly an old and dying religion of the Western world, a shrinking spiritual phenomenon with diminishing relevance to the culture of the developed countries of Europe, North America, Asia and Africa and Oceania. But nothing could be further from the truth. The worldwide impact and universality of the Christian faith continue to make it perhaps the most relevant cultural influence around the globe. Observers and shapers of culture all over the world it only at their own peril.
2.	Consider some of the titles by which Jesus is called in the New Testament. He is called Teacher (or Rabbi), Prophet, High Priest, Servant of God, Messiah (or Christ), Son of David, Son of Man, Lord, Word, Savior and Son of God. Each of these titles helps us to understand different aspects of Jesus' nature and work. But none of them, alone or even together, give a and exhaustive identification of Jesus.
3.	Jim Edwards says, "The saving activity of God was and is expressed in the name of Jesus Christ. The name of Jesus is thereby linked in the closest possible way to the name of God. "No other name" does not refer to a second name besides the name of God, but to the unity of God with Jesus Christ, signifying one name, one nature, one saving activity. The shared nature of God and Jesus is signaled in the most striking way by the of the early church to pray to God <i>in the name of Jesus</i> ."
4.	"The salvation brought by Jesus Christ is not limited to the world as a place of human habitation, or even the sum total of human experience. The salvation of Jesus extends to the <i>kosmos</i> , both the physical universe that can be known by science, and the world that extends beyond the empirical universe The world over which Jesus Christ rules includes all spiritual realities as well." 
