Comments for Contemplation

Joy: Partnership in the Gospel Mark 8:34–38; Philippians 1:3–11

1.	Isn't it amazing how God uses certain people in our lives to draw us closer to him? Sometimes it's our parents or grandparents or adopted grandparents. Sometimes it's a friend who is in our life only briefly. Sometimes it's a fellow Christian or a pastor or someone we listen to occasionally. But most of us here have heard the good news of the gospel from people who genuinely love us, and we have responded to the Lord in faith. The question for us today is this: are we in the gospel to which we have responded?			
2.	God certainly could have used other means for bringing the faith to us, but historically that is how it happened. We can thank God for the church at Philippi, which established the Christianity in Europe, and enabled the faith to eventually come to America. But how has Christian faith come to you? To whom are you indebted? Or are you among those who are just and wondering if the Christian faith has something for you? Or are you prepared to be a true partner in the gospel?			
3.	8. "An idol has such a controlling position in your heart that you can spend most of your passion and energy, your emotional and financial resources, on it without giving it a second thought. It can be family and children, or career and making money, or achievement and critical acclaim, or saving 'face' and social standing. It can be a romantic relationship, peer approval, competence and skill, secure and comfortable circumstances, your beauty or your brains, a great political or social cause, your morality and, or even success in the Christian ministry." [Tim Keller]			
4.	So the Philippians are partners with Paul in the gospel, believing and proclaiming God's Message, from the day that Paul first proclaimed it to them until now, the writing of this letter. They have been loyal to Paul, and they have stuck with him through his imprisonment and trial as well as other events. Paul's great love for them in this letter.			
5.	Could there be any more appropriate message to our culture today? We are saturated with a view of love that has little to do with the love required for true friendship, let alone marital love and commitment. Our culture is the great cultivator of sentimental mush, and we have made an idol of our passions and Jesus helps us to get beyond the mush			
6.	It is not about us saving ourselves, showing our achievements, or trying to hide our belief in Jesus Christ. It is about sharing in the koinonia of the gospel, the partnership or fellowship in the gospel, helping people to know Jesus Christ as their great lover, helper, Savior and Lord. It is about in people, giving our love and giving our lives to see that they know Jesus.


Rev. Dr. Larry Thomas July 21 through August 18 - The Early Church
