Comments for Contemplation

Transformed John 4:7–30, 39–42; Romans 12:1–3

1.	Without the existence of an all-knowing moral Governor of the universe, the Divine Judge and Arbiter, Adams argued, there can be no right or wrong, only subjective opinion, whim, and desire. Turning from God is a recipe for a moral chaos in which no appeal to reason prevails, a world in which brute decides what is right and wrong. Belief in God brings moral light into the darkness, and calls for fidelity to truth.
2.	"Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what he wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always
3.	Last week we asked if we are being saved and what it means to be saved, or justified and put into a right relationship with God. Today we are looking at a similar but not identical question. Are you a follower of Jesus who is being conformed to the world around us, shoved into the of our culture and what it says is important, or are you being transformed by the renewing of your mind and discerning what is the will of God, as it says in the NRSV?
4.	Jesus' encounter with the Samaritan woman at the well in John 4 is also a story of transformation. It is truly an amazing story. Jesus boldly speaks to her in the middle of the day, although she is likely a woman of ill repute coming at that hour. The disciples are stunned he is speaking with her, but didn't ask what he was doing. He talks to her about living water, and not having to anymore. She is amazed that as a Jew he is speaking with a woman of Samaria.
5.	What would Jesus say about our transformation as a congregation? Do we worship God in Spirit and in truth, and do we know how to offer ourselves as living sacrifices, showing our spiritual worship in our everyday lives? Are we listening to the right in our lives?
