A Matter of the Heart

<u>Sunday, November 10,</u> is GET YOURSELF TO CHURCH Sunday!

"And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, **not** neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." – Hebrews 10:24-25 (emphasis added)

As many of you have heard, we are doing things a bit differently this year. Sunday, November 10, is our "WILL YOU GROW?" Generosity Campaign Commitment Sunday, when we will hand out the "2020 Estimate of Giving Card" to each family, individual, or



household that is present so that the card can be filled out and brought forward that day *in worship*. We are asking every active family and person to come to worship and to answer that question, *will you grow?*, in the affirmative.

We believe that the Lord is calling us to a new level of prayer, commitment, and faith in Christ. That means that we are urging each person in our congregation to take responsibility for, not just thinking about growing, but, truly committing ourselves to grow:

1) in our relationship with God in Jesus Christ, and 2) in our giving to the Lord's work in this church. This is about trusting in the Lord in order to realize and receive a new depth of God's love and grace, and to experience the power of the Holy Spirit in our everyday walk with Jesus.

We are learning that biblical generosity is directly linked to discipleship. Being generous with our financial resources is a spiritual issue, not a financial issue. That is proved by the incredible generosity that is often shown by those who are people of relatively modest means, and vice versa. A person's giving patterns often have very little to do with their actual income. That is because generous giving to the Lord's work is normally determined by the spiritual condition of a person's heart. A heart that is yielded to the Lord and to his kingdom will result in spiritual and biblical generosity.

Often, pastors and other church leaders "tip-toe" around the issues of money and biblical generosity, for fear of offending a few people. And indeed, over the years, I have seen some venomous reactions to various pleas for money to meet the needs

of the church. Yet, Jesus spoke very openly about the issues of money and possessions. He knows our money is a "heart" issue. He said, "... For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). About two-thirds of the parables and nearly one of every ten verses in the four Gospel accounts address the issue of money and possessions. If Jesus was not reluctant to talk about money and possessions, neither should we be reluctant. We do need to do the hard work of learning a biblical perspective on generosity.

There is a temptation for churches to approach their financial needs simply from a fundraising perspective, rather than a generosity perspective. The fundraising perspective places more emphasis on the need of the church to fund a budget, and success is measured purely in dollars. The biblical generosity perspective realizes what Jesus taught: the amount given is not the measure, but the heart's commitment is. Jesus said, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all of them; for all of them have contributed out of their abundance, but she out of her poverty has put in all she had to live on" (Luke 21:3-4). The spiritual nature of a person's generous effort makes all the difference.

God owns it all ("the earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof..."), and God does not need our money, but we need to give in order to experience the fullness of life He desires for us. It is an act of grace on God's part that He even allows us to participate financially in his work. Our "Will You Grow?" Commitment Sunday on November 10 is based on the philosophy that faith is more important than finances, and the quality of the gift is more important than the quantity.

We hope and pray that we will see you and your family or loved ones on Sunday, November 10, for our Generosity Campaign Commitment Sunday! And may it all be done to the glory of God!


