# Comments for Contemplation

Sent John 20:19–23; Matthew 28:16–20

- 1. But the journey which our youth-worshiping culture sells us has many paths that end in self-centeredness or even in narcissism, the inordinate love of self. This has tragic consequences for the Body of Christ, and the problem seems to span the age ranges. These days, it seems, \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ is not limited to the young or to any particular age. Maturity is always a spiritual process, and it is essential to being made into a true disciple of Jesus Christ.
- 2. How do we contextualize the message of Jesus to reach those who say they would never set foot in a church building, who say they have no interest in considering the claims of Christ, who say that they have no need of a Savior because they don't need saving? How do we grow from being not only *disciples*, or students and \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus, to also being *apostles*, meaning those who are commissioned and *sent* by Jesus?
- 3. In the vision of the prophet Isaiah, chapter six, which we did not read today, Isaiah sees the Lord, high and lifted up. And he is awestruck by his own sinfulness before the holy God, confessing it, and receiving forgiveness. Then he hears the Lord say, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Isaiah responds, "Here am I. Send me." We tend to think that this is a \_\_\_\_\_\_ for prophets only, or for missionaries and pastors only. But in truth, God is asking the same question of American Christians today.
- 4. You see, many of the disciples found a way to watch from a distance while Jesus was being crucified. They watched the large nails or spikes that were driven into his wrists in order to keep his body hanging on the cross. And after he had died, they watched the soldier confirm Jesus' death by stabbing him in the side with a \_\_\_\_\_\_, and saw that blood and water came out, indicating that he had been dead for some time. Now, the holes in his wrists and his side were identifying marks for the disciples to know that it really was Jesus who was appearing to them.
- 5. Jesus says all authority in heaven and on earth has been given to him. The only person who could make such a statement would be a person who has just been raised from the dead, and that's what Jesus is. Believe it or not, our government, and all governments, are \_\_\_\_\_\_ to Him. One day every person and every nation will give account to Him. Those who bear false witness, those who steal, those who are corrupt, and all of us as well, will answer to Jesus.
