The Characters of Christmas: Elizabeth and Zechariah

| 1. | Madeleine L'Engle says this: "Those who believe they believe in God but without passion in the heart, without anguish of mind, without uncertainty, without doubt, and even at times without despair, believe only in the idea of God, and not in God himself." Those are profound and powerful words. Questions and doubts that make us seek for truth and search for can be very good. | | | |
| 2. | There are, of course, other kinds of doubt that are not healthy. When we doubt everyone around us, unless we are in some sort of hostile captivity, then we may have a problem. When our doubts begin to overwhelm us, leading us to unbelief and even chronic despair, then we may have lost our bearings and our perspective. When we doubt what we know is a clear word from the Lord, then we are shutting ourselves off from the blessing of to that word. | | | |
| 3. | For Christians, Advent is a time of preparation and repentance, a time when we can focus on our faith in Christ and allow the Lord to help us change and grow in new ways. Of course with the busyness and commercialism of the season, that is not always an easy thing to do. But I would challenge us all to find and space and a new rhythm for prayer, for worship, for service to others and for a personal, like a visit or a call, with someone who could really use it. That can make Christmas truly meaningful, and will make a difference in our world. | | | |
| 4. | Zechariah and Elizabeth were getting on in years, and they had no children because Elizabeth was barren. The assumption in that day was that if you were barren you were doing something wrong, or you were being punished. For years they had prayed to the Lord for children and now that prayer was a distant memory. We can assume that they had moved on to seek out what God had for them in other areas of their lives, but they were deeply disappointed at not being able to have children. You can bet that they had questions and | | | |
| 5. | This child whose name is to be John, which means "God is gracious," will be a forerunner of the Lord like the prophet Elijah. He will turn the hearts of parents to their children and the hearts of children to their parents, but it will be to make ready a people for the Lord. If Zechariah would have just said "thank you," or "praise God!" he would have been fine. But he asks (and this is my guess as to how | | | |

he said it) "How will I know that this is so? For I am an old man, and my wife is getting on in years."
