Comments for Contemplation

How Will It End? Psalm 33:13–22; Mark 16:1–8

1.	The gospel according to Mark may be the most important gospel account that we have. Both Matthew and Luke used Mark directly and extensively in writing their own gospels, indicating great deference and for what Mark had written. It is believed that the author of this gospel may well have been John Mark, the cousin of Barnabas, who is mentioned in no fewer than seven places in other New Testament writings.
2.	Last week we saw how the cross is central to Mark's point of how we are to understand Jesus as the Son of God. We also began to understand that we must see an ultimate and spiritual reality as we look at the crucifixion, because those who look only with their physical eyes, and do not look with humble hearts and eyes of faith, do not see the incredible act of love and atonement taking place before them. In the cross of Jesus Christ, we begin to appreciate that the ultimate reality of God's redemptive love and transcends the worst tragedy we can imagine.
3.	Perhaps like Manchester, John Mark died before he was finished, either killed by the hand of henchmen of the emperors Nero or Vespasian, or simply by natural causes. Perhaps the original manuscript of Mark, a codex which we do not have, was damaged in transporting it around the house churches in Rome, and the end was torn off and, leaving us only with verse eight which even sounds in the Greek as if it ends in mid-sentence.
4.	But there is one other consideration we have to grapple with, and that is the notion that either Mark or the Lord or both intended for us to have only these eight verses to deal with as we consider the empty tomb ourselves. Could it be that Mark intended, as he has elsewhere in this book, to surprise us, to shock us, and to shake us up a bit with this abrupt ending? Imagine for a moment. If this were all we had from the gospels in terms of knowing of Jesus' resurrection, would you believe it?
5.	The truth is, if it weren't for the resurrection of Jesus Christ, we would not be here today, and there would be no Christian church anywhere in the world. We would not celebrate Christmas because it was the resurrection of Jesus that created the community that researched and wrote down the narratives about Jesus. The theology of the incarnation, which is highlighted at Christmas, is nevertheless dependent on the theology of the cross and resurrection, which is highlighted at Easter.
6.	The stunning part of this abrupt ending to Mark, is that it seems to be addressed to us relatively comfortable Americans in the 21st century; because we also have trouble believing and obeying. How many of you are still just starting to believe what the Bible teaches? How many of you, are still just getting to know the Lord in a personal way? How many of you, when told to share the good news of Jesus and his love, are still seized with terror and amazement, and say to anyone because you are afraid?
