Comments for Contemplation

TRANSFORM – The Change To Which Jesus Calls Us Deepening Divine Relationship/Growing Love for Jesus

Eph. 3:14-21; Col. 1:15-20; Matt. 22:34-40

1.	God loves me, Jesus is my Savior, I've been forgiven for my sins, and my life in heaven will come eventually. So glad I have that taken care of. Check. While there is the beginning of a relationship with Jesus here, there is no maturity, there is no reciprocity, no gratitude, no sense of awe and praise and worship and humility. A mature relationship with God in Jesus Christ must celebrate with others what God has done, and that person is then propelled into the world to make a
2.	The earliest Christian confession was atomic in its brevity: Jesus is Lord . This carpenter from Nazareth, who called and taught disciples, who healed people, who died on a cross like a common criminal and who was miraculously raised from the dead was actually the one true God incarnate, God in the flesh, the same God who himself to Moses at Mt. Sinai as the Lord, the God of Israel. This God was revealed to the world as our Lord Jesus Christ.
3.	Historian O.M. Bakke wrote a study called <i>When Children Became People</i> : The Birth of Childhood in Early Christianity, in which he noted that in the ancient world, children didn't get named until the eighth day or so. Up until then there was a chance that the infant would be killed or left to die of exposureThis custom changed because of a group of people who remembered that they were followers of a man who said, 'Let the little come to me.' [Ortberg]
4.	"In time the movement he started would give rise to libraries and then guilds of learning. Eventually Oxford and Cambridge and Harvard and Yale and virtually the entire Western system of education and scholarship would arise because of his followers. The insistence on universal literacy would grow out of an understanding that this Jesus, who was himself a teacher who highly praised truth, told his followers to enable every person in the world to" [Ortberg]
5.	And Isaiah gets it, just as we should or at least, we will one day, get it, when he says, "Woe is me, I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" So here we have the essence and the beginning of worship: A sense of the utter holiness and apart-ness of the God that we worship, of our unworthiness to stand before this God, and a of our sin in the presence of God and God's holiness.
