

Christians at Our Best

You might think with the election behind us, everything (and everyone) might just calm down and everyone could just be cool for a moment. But nope! And by this point, I just expect it. News and entertainment seem to be on a daily, hourly, or moment-by-moment mission to provoke us. And do we ever fall for it. Granted, there are some things worth being outraged over. But the challenge for us is, how do we channel our emotions and reactions? Pick any social media platform and they are full of rants and rage. If you do not use social media, read the letters to the editor or listen to the "viewers voice" on the local news. Although I have to say I expect the world to behave that way, it makes me sad when I see fellow Christians act like this and here is why. I think it genuinely hurts our witness. I have been personally wrestling with this the past few years. I use social media to share pictures of our kids, events at church, and my BBQ adventures. I have formally retired from Facebook debating over most things and I can say my life is better off for it. But even that can send mixed messages. Not commenting or posting about certain events will bring the question, or accusation, of being complicit, even supporting something heinous. So perhaps while I have chosen a path that has worked best for me, I am questioning has that worked best for the kingdom?

The line is fine, friends. At the last Fellowship Community event in



Tulsa, those of us who attended heard some great keynote addresses by Ed Stetzer. He is a pastor, author, speaker, researcher, church planter, while serving as the Billy Graham Distinguished Chair of Church, Mission, and Evangelism at Wheaton College as well as the Executive Director of the Billy Graham Center at Wheaton College. Of his many and worthy reads, he published Christians in the Age of Outrage: How to Bring our Best When the World Is at its Worst in late 2018 and guess what it is still mightily relevant.

Stetzer wrote the book, "to help Christians think through the unique challenges of this age [of outrage]."

I thought this was most appropriate for Lent where some take up the practice of giving something up. I think we, as a faith, would be much better off, more impactful, more fruitful, if we gave up acting outrageously online and/or in our relationships. So, drawing off the biblical foundations of this book and the accompanying 6-part study, *Christians at Our Best*, I will be preaching and teaching on this subject. You can purchase copies of these from Amazon or elsewhere. Some Sunday school classes may choose to fully dive in and do the study together. Others may not and that is okay. My plan is to hold some virtual group studies and discussions. Days and times are still being worked out so stay tuned! Keep the faith!
