Sermon Notes

What's in a Name: Christ the Prophet

Isaiah 61:1-2; Luke 4:16-30

"He whom God has sent speaks the words of God, for he gives the Spirit without measure. The Father loves the Son and has placed all things in his hands. Whoever believes in the Son has eternal life; whoever disobeys the Son will not see life, but must endure God's wrath." - John 3:34-36

The offices of prophet ("utters the words of God"), king ("has given all things into his hands"), and priest ("whoever believes in the Son has eternal life") are seen in this short text.

"To Know the Purpose for Which Christ Was Sent by the Father, and What He Conferred Upon Us, We Must Look Above All at Three Things in Him: the Prophetic Office, Kingship, and Priesthood" - John Calvin's Institutes

"Therefore, in order that faith may find a firm basis for salvation in Christ, and thus rest in him, this principle must be laid down: the office enjoined upon Christ the Father consists of three parts. For he was given to be prophet, king, and priest. Yet it would be of little value to know these names without understanding their purpose and use." - Calvin
