

Sermon Notes

All In

Amos 5:6-7, 10-15; Mark 10:17-31

"It is natural to paint an ugly picture of this man. One can imagine him in brightly colored robes, perhaps with gilded accents; he is clean-shaven with a good composure. He speaks eloquently and probably commands respect when he is in a crowd. He has most likely had an easy life with an exotic and lavish upbringing. It is easy not to like him. It is easy to think of him as having hoarded his wealth, not giving to the poor or to his church. He may be getting to the end of his life and wants to ensure his eternity. Surely, we would like to think, that is why he approaches Jesus."

"... people come to church on the Sabbath with only one question in their minds: Is it true? The providence of God, the saving power of Jesus Christ, the comforting presence of the Holy Spirit, the resurrection from the dead, the forgiveness of sin: Is it true?" - Karl Barth

"Jesus does not condemn him or belittle him for the way he has handled his wealth. Rather, Jesus loves the man and affirms him for following the commandments but does mention that the man lacks one thing. Instead of focusing on what he has not done, Jesus loves him for the commandments he has honored."

"Christian tradition has assumed that he went away sorrowful because he was unwilling to sell all that he had, give it to the poor, and follow Jesus. Another possibility is that he went away sorrowful because he had decided to sell all he had and follow Jesus. That bold action would not have been emotionless. That would have been a decisive step into the future, resulting in an emotional letting go of all that he had and the relationships that came with his possessions." - David B. Howell

"[It] is not a story about money, because, if it were, we could buy our way into heaven by cashing in our chips right now, and you know that is not so. None of us earns eternal life, no matter what we do. We can keep the Commandments until we are blue in the face; we can sign our paychecks over to Mother Teresa and rattle tin cups for our supper without ever earning a place at the banquet table of God. The kingdom of God is not for sale. It never has been; it never will be. The poor cannot buy it with their poverty, and the rich cannot buy it with their riches. The kingdom of God is a consummate gift." - Barbara Brown Taylor
