Sermon Notes

"My Lord and my God!"

Acts 5:27-32; John 20:19-31

1. In The Lord of the Rings Sam and Frodo are struggling to climb Mount Doom and destroy the One Ring. At once Sam remembers the stories they were told as children, those tales of adventure and courage. "Why, to think of it," he says, "we're in the same tale still! It's going on. Don't the great tales never end?!" One commentator writes: "Fulfillment comes when we realize, like Sam, that each of us is in the story, too. We are not just meaningless clumps of matter whose life is simply suffering and inevitable death. No. We are part of a grand scheme--we are important characters in God's story of life."

2. When have you been an answer to someone's prayers? You have probably been an answer to prayer much more often than you can imagine--and not necessarily for the reasons you might think. What does it do to you to realize you are an answer to someone's prayers?
