



ADORATION



This American gospel song became popular in England in the late 19th century, then returned to this country in the mid-20th century with the Billy Graham crusades. Its continuing popularity may well be due to the freedom from subjective considerations in its praise of God.

ADORATION





The author-composer of this unrhymed hymn regards it as a meditation and prayer deeply rooted in many scriptures, most connected with the theme of light: Genesis 1:17; Psalm 139:12; Isaiah 60:19; Malachi 4:2; John 14:8; Ephesians 5:8; Hebrews 12:1–2; 1 John 1:5; Revelation 21:23.



This praise song can be understood as a sung version of the first part of the answer to the first question of the Westminster Catechism: that a human being's "chief end is to glorify God." Numerous related Scriptures can be cited, including 1 Corinthians 6:20 and 10:31.

Sermon Notes

When Worlds Collide Acts 10:1-23a-43

Cornelius: Gentile; high-ranking officer in the Roman Empire; a man of the world; a professional man

Peter: Jew; no rank at all, but a follower of a country carpenter who had been put to death; a country boy with little or no experience outside of his own province; a laboring man

The essence of the first preaching about Jesus:

- 1) Jesus was sent by God and equipped him with the Spirit and power.
- 2) Jesus exercised a ministry of healing.
- 3) They crucified him.
- 4) He rose again.
- 5) The Christian preacher and teacher is a witness of the resurrection.
- 6) The result of all this is forgiveness of sins and a new relationship with God.

"Each of these two men had what the other needed. Peter had all the strength of institutional religion and needed to be set free from the confinements of it; while Cornelius had all the freedom of the religious spirit of the Gentiles and needed the supporting framework of institutional religion which would give that spirit discipline and direction." - The Interpreter's Bible
