



Sermon Notes

"Fearfully and Wonderfully Made" Luke 14:25–33

Today's sermon relies on two remarkable books by Dr. Paul Brand and journalist Philip Yancey. These books are *Fearfully and Wonderfully Made*, Zondervan, 1980, and *In His Image*, Zondervan, 1984.

Did you know that, normally, your body has 25 billion white cells—that's 25,000,000,000—that circulate freely throughout your blood and that you have 25 billion more—another 25,000,000,000 white blood cells—on blood vessel walls. When you are battling disease, your body quickly mobilizes many times that number of white cells, and your white cells hone in to fight to protect you from your 'invader.' Antibodies guide the white cells through the fray to your viruses or other invaders. In your lifetime, your body must confront a staggering number of invaders that would make you ill.

So, in Dr. Brand's words, "The body must stockpile an enormous arsenal of weapons." One kind of antibody 'knows' how to battle against measles, for instance, and another 'knows' how to protect you against infantile paralysis. How can your body possibly prepare every type of antibody you will need in your lifetime? Dr. Brand says that immunologists answer with a little joke and an acronym: "GOD." In this case, "GOD" stands for "Generator of Diversity." That is, your body has the incredible ability to manufacture whatever defense is needed. Dr. Brand quotes Dr. Ronald Glasser (who died Friday, August 26, 2022). Dr. Glasser called this process "a mixture of mystery and chemistry...a combination of physics and grace down at themolecular level." See *In His Image*, pages 84-85.
